#### **TVBC Local Plan**

You may remember that last year TVBC published a draft local plan for 2029-2040 which included proposals to allocate two sites at the north of the parish, on the edge of Ludgershall, as strategic housing sites for 1500 dwellings. The plan was withdrawn following the government decision in December to increase the national house building target. On 18th June TVBC published an updated plan which reflects the new government policy. This has resulted in an increase in the proposed allocation in our parish to 1713 dwellings. In addition there is a new proposed allocation of 1034 dwellings at Weyhill.

The draft local plan will now go through a period of public consultation and the Parish Council encourages you all to feedback you thoughts about the plan.

### **Neighbourhood and Community Planning**

TVBC support communities to plan and develop practical ways to improve their area, through formal tools such as a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), Village Design Statement (VDS) or Parish Plan. Currently we do not have any such plan in place within Kimpton Parish, and having a plan would not have prevented the allocation of land for strategic housing sites, however if we put one in place now we can have some influence over the design of the sites and may benefit from increased Community Infrastructure payments from developers.

#### **TVBC Recycling changes**

TVBC are making some changes to provide more kerbside recycling to us later this year. During the summer they are planning to introduce the collection of batteries, vapes and small electrical items as part of weekly collections and in October will begin a new collection of food waste.

TVBC will send notices to all properties as the schemes are introduced and we will put more details in our next newsletter too.

### **Volunteering Opportunities**

The really great news is that since the last issue we have had volunteers for two of the roles, the community still has lots of volunteering opportunities

- Parish Councillor We currently have a vacancy for an additional Parish Councillor. Joining the Parish Council could be the ideal opportunity for you to help our community.
- Community Speedwatch Group We have had one resident ask us about the idea of monitoring traffic speed at the roadside. We can do this by joining an existing Community Speedwatch Group or creating a new Group if there is one. The Parish Council is investigating this, can anyone else who is interested in being part of a Community Speedwatch Group please let us know.
- Footpath Wardens Did you know there are 21 footpaths in Kimpton Parish? Maintaining them is the responsibility of local landowners but to support them, we currently have a team of three volunteers who help manage the footpaths. If you would like to join the team which is part of Hampshire Countryside Services please let us know.
- **Emergency Help** Do you have the training, skills or resources to help in an emergency? Do you have a medical qualification or training? Your help would be invaluable to the community.
- Village Hall Trustees The Village Hall provides us with a community space for local events. The Trustees are looking for at least one more person to join their team, if you think that could be you let us know
- The Parish does not have a neighbourhood plan if you think you would like to be part of a team who could help shape the future of the Parish let us know.
- The Skylark Federation, comprising Kimpton, Thruxton & Fyfield and Appleshaw St Peter's CE Primary Schools, is seeking enthusiastic individuals to join its Governing Board.

A little reminder: if your property has hedges or trees which border the road, or you have a footpath running through or bordering your land, please ensure they are trimmed back to keep the road safe for both pedestrians and vehicles and the footpath accessible. If you plan to hire a contractor to carry out any work after the bird nesting season, it's a good idea to book them soon as they get busy at that time of year.
